5. Entries:

The closing date for entries is [Sunday March 27th 2022 at 10 p.m.](#) Entries must be made using the enclosed Excel form and should be mailed to kristalcup@hotmail.com. The organizing committee will limit the entries up to the maximum in relation to the available ice. **Entries will be accepted on a first come, first serve base.**



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6. Limitations:

All clubs are invited to take part in this competition. In case of too many entries the organizer reserves the right to limit the number of participants on a first come, first served base.

7. Time table:

A detailed time table will be supplied as soon as possible after closing of entries. The timetable can be consulted at the website www.gskristallijn.be. Please (re-)check for possible changes when approaching the day of the competition.

During the competition, minor changes to the time table may occur due to organizational circumstances.

8. Music and 'planned elements form' for Free Skating:

Every free skater shall provide their competition music **before Sunday March 27th 2022 at 10 p.m.**, by emailing an mp3 file to the following email address: kristalcup@hotmail.com

On the day of the competition, every free skater shall have a memory stick with his/her music as backup copy.

Please send the 'planned elements' form (see annex) to: kristalcup@hotmail.com.

For the Ice Dance categories, participants shall also provide their competition music, according to the ISU requirements of rhythm and (constant) tempo. They must do so **before Sunday March 27th 2022 at 10 p.m.** by emailing an mp3 file to the following email address: kristalcup@hotmail.com

On the day of the competition, every ice dancer shall have a memory stick with his/her music as backup copy.

9. Starting order:

For each category, the starting order will be determined by draw. Further details will follow asap.

10. Liability:

According to ISU rules, skaters participate in the competition at their own risk. The liability for health and accident insurance lies with the athletes, officials, and all other members of the team. Such insurance must include full medical care and repatriation. The organizer cannot be held liable for accidents or damage caused by a third party.

11. Entry fee:

Entering the competition, the entry fee must be paid as follows:

Free Skating event: € 60 per person

First Single Ice Dance event: € 40 per person



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Second Single Ice Dance event: € 30 per person (ice dance)

First Couple Ice Dance event: € 30 per person

Second Couple Ice Dance event: € 20 per person

Shadow Dance Duo event: € 40 per person

Shadow Dance 3 persons and more: € 20 per person

GSK will send an invoice to the participating clubs after the closing date of the subscriptions. If payments are not received within 10 days after the invoice date, the organizing club has the right to cancel or replace the entry concerned.

There will be no refund of entrance fee in case of withdrawal or other.

There will be a podium for all categories. There is a podium for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place. All other skaters can consult the results afterwards on the site: www.gskristallijn.be.

NIS judging-system will be used.

Rules Free Skating Competition

Age Category Singles:

Age Category Young Adults Free Skating:

Skaters have reached at least the age of seventeen (17) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Class I skaters born between 1st July 1983 and 30th June 1993

Class II skaters born between 1st July 1973 and 30th June 1983

Class III skaters born between 1st July 1963 and 30th June 1973

Class IV skaters born between 1st July 1953 and 30th June 1963

Class V skaters born on or before 30th June 1953



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The (Inter) National Adult Figure Skating Single Regulations will include the following disciplines:

- **Adult Bronze Free Skating Ladies and Men**

This is a category for skaters who can execute all single jumps but NO single Axel.

- **Adult Silver Free Skating Ladies and Men**

This is a category for skaters who can execute all single jumps **including** single Axel.

- **Adult Gold Free Skating Ladies and Men**

This is a category for skaters who can execute all single jumps including single Axel and double jumps but NO double Flip, double Lutz and no double Axel.

- **Adult Master Free Skating Ladies and Men**

This is a category for skaters who can execute all single and double jumps including double Axel and triples.

General rules Single Skating: (National Criteria)

- A Competitor must be a member of a club which is itself a member of an ISU Member. Competitors do not require any Clearance Certificate or release or any other permission from their ISU Member for entering the Competition.
- Skaters must have reached at least the age of **sixteen (16)** by July 1st preceding the competition for **all categories**.
- Coaches can participate in Adults competitions.
- Skaters can compete in Adults competitions without a Competition Level Test.
- Adult skaters who qualify to participate in B-competitions **can** still participate in Adults competitions. However, if there's an Adults competition linked to a B-competition, they **cannot** compete in both the level category and the Adults competition.
- Adult skaters who qualify to participate in A-Competitions **cannot** compete in Adults Competitions.
- Skaters who only compete in Adults competitions keep their Figure Skating Level Test for B-Competition level categories.
- Skaters **cannot** increase their Figure Skating Level nor PCS Level Test in Adult categories.
- The club must enter the competitor.



- All categories of Ladies and Men must be divided into separate groups for the competition but can warm up together.
- For Adult competitions non-licensed coaches (initiators or monitors) are allowed in coaches' areas.
- It is expected that competitors will enter at a level that is appropriate to their current skating ability.
- All Belgian clubs which organize a National Adults competition must put these regulations of the federation KBKF/FRBPA in their announcement for the categories for which they are valid.

Technical Requirements – Free Skating

ADULT BRONZE FREE SKATING

Warm-up: 4 minutes for Ladies and Men

The maximum time for Ladies and Men: Maximum 1:40 min +/- 10 sec.

A competitor in the bronze free skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

A maximum of four (4) jump elements, consisting only of single jumps. **Axel type jumps, double jumps and triple jumps are NOT permitted.** There may be up to two (2) jump combinations in the free program. Each jump combination may consist of two (2) listed jumps.

- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.

A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation one of which must be a spin in one position with no change of foot. **Flying spins are NOT permitted.**

- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: three (3) for a spin in one position with no change of foot, and six (6), (3+3) for a spin with change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with 2 revolutions will receive no level and no value, however a spin with less than 3 revolutions is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- Spin combinations must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- The change of foot in any spin must be preceded and followed by a spin position with at least three (3) revolutions.
- Only features up to **level 1** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.



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A maximum of one (1) Choreographic Sequence, covering at least half (1/2) of the ice surface.

- A choreographic sequence consists of any kind of movements like steps, turns, spirals, arabesques, spread eagles, Ina Bauer's, hydro blading, transitional (unlisted) jumps, spinning movements etc
- The pattern is not restricted.
- A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges GOE only.

The 5 Program Components are judged

Component factor for ladies and men: 1.6

FALL: -0.5 Pt

ADULT SILVER FREE SKATING

Warm-up: 4 minutes for Ladies and Men

The maximum time for Ladies and Men: Maximum 2:00min +/- 10 sec.

A competitor in the silver free skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

A maximum of five (5) jump elements, consisting of any single jumps (**including the single Axel**). **Double jumps and triple jumps are NOT permitted.** There may up to two (2) jump combinations or jump sequences in the free program.

- One (1) jump combination may consist of up to three (3) listed jumps. The other jump combination may consist of two (2) jump combination of listed jumps.
- A jump sequence consists of two (2) listed jumps, beginning with any listed jump immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump.
- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered as a listed jump only when used in a combination in between two listed jumps.
- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of the connecting footwork.

A maximum of two (2) spins of a different abbreviation one of which must be a spin combination. Flying spins **ARE** permitted.

- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for any spin with no change of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with two (2) revolutions will receive no level and no value, however a spin with less than three (3) revolutions is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- The change of foot in any spin must be preceded and followed by a spin position with at least three (3) revolutions.



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- A spin combination must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- Only features up to **level 2** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for Level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

A maximum of one (1) Choreographic Sequence, covering at least half (1/2) of the ice surface.

- A choreographic sequence consists of any kind of movements like steps, turns, spirals, arabesques, spread eagles, Ina Bauer's, hydro blading, transitional (unlisted) jumps, spinning movements etc
- The pattern is not restricted.
- A choreographic sequence has a base value and will be evaluated by the judges GOE only.

The 5 Program Components are judged

Component factor for Ladies and Men: 1.6

FALL -0.5 Pt

ADULT GOLD FREE SKATING

Warm-up: 4 minutes for Ladies and Men

The maximum time for Ladies and Men: Maximum 2:40min +/- 10 sec.

A competitor in the gold free skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

A maximum of six (6) jump elements, consisting of any single jumps (including the single Axel) or double jumps. **Double Flip, double Lutz, double Axel and triple jumps are NOT permitted.** There may be up to three (3) jump combinations or jump sequences in the free program.

- One (1) jump combination may consist of up to three (3) listed jumps. Two (2) jump combination may consist of two (2) listed jumps.
- A jump sequence consists of two (2) listed single or double jumps, beginning with any listed jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve or the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump.
- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered a listed jump only when used in a combination in between two listed jumps.
- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of the connecting footwork.



A maximum of three (3) spins of a different abbreviation one (1) of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one (1) of which must be a flying spin or spin with flying entrance.

- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: four (4) for any spin with no change of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with two (2) revolutions will receive no level and no value, however a spin with less than three (3) revolutions is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- A spin combination must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- The change of foot in any spin must be preceded and followed by a spin position with at least three (3) revolutions.
- Only features up to **level 3** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

A maximum of one (1) Step Sequence, fully utilizing the ice surface.

- Only the first executed attempt of a step sequence will contribute to the technical score.

The 5 Program Components are judged

Component factor for Ladies and Men: 1.6

FALL -1.0 Pt.

ADULT MASTER FREE SKATING

Warm-up: 4 minutes for Ladies and Men

The maximum time for Ladies and Men: Maximum 3:00 min +/- 10 sec.

A competitor in the master free skating event must perform a well-balanced program that may contain:

A maximum of six (6) jump elements, one of which must be an Axel type jump. **Single, double and triple jumps are permitted.** There may be up to three (3) jump combinations or jump sequences in the free program.

- One (1) jump combination may consist of up to three (3) listed jumps. Two (2) jump combinations may consist of two (2) listed jumps.
- A jump sequence consists of two (2) listed jumps of any number of revolutions, beginning with any listed jump, immediately followed by an Axel type jump with a direct step from the landing curve of the first jump to the take-off curve of the Axel jump.
- Each listed jump may be performed a maximum of two (2) times.
- Please note that the Euler (half-loop) is considered as a listed jump only when used in combination in between two listed jumps.



- Non-listed jumps may be included in the program as part of the connecting footwork.

A maximum of three (3) spins of a different abbreviation, one (1) of which must be a spin combination with a change of foot and one (1) must be a flying spin or a spin with flying entrance.

- The spins must have a required minimum number of revolutions: five (5) for any spin with no change of foot, and eight (8) for any spin with a change of foot.
- A spin that has no basic position with two (2) revolutions will receive no level and no value, however a spin with less than three (3) revolutions is considered as a skating movement and not a spin.
- A spin combination must include a minimum of two (2) different basic positions with two (2) revolutions in each of these positions anywhere within the spin. To receive full value, a spin combination must include all three (3) basic positions.
- The change of foot in any spin must be preceded and followed by a spin position with at least three (3) revolutions.
- Only features up to **level 4** will be counted. Any additional features will not count for level requirements and will be ignored by the Technical Panel.

A maximum of one (1) Step Sequence, fully utilizing the ice surface.

- Only the first executed attempt of a step sequence will contribute to the technical score.

The 5 Program Components are judged

Component factor for Ladies and Men: 1.6

FALL -1.0 Pt

Technical Requirements – Artistic Free Skating

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ARTISTIC FREE SKATING

The artistic events consist of Free Skating and Pair Free Skating programs judged only on the basis of the Program Components:

- Skating skills
- Transitions
- Performance
- Composition
- Interpretation/Timing

See ISU Special Regulations and Technical Rules 2018, Singles & Pair Skating, Rule 504, paragraph 3 for a detailed description of Program Components. The respective Rules can be found on the ISU website.



There will be no technical panel and no technical mark given. The points for each Program Component are multiplied by a factor of 1.0. Falls are not subject to a deduction but may have a negative impact on the Program Components.

The Artistic Free Skating competition is an athletic competition that is intended to allow skaters to demonstrate their skating ability as defined by the five program components of the ISU judging system. Credit for the required technical elements is based solely on the ability of such movements to enhance the chosen theme and support the music. Credit will not be given for their technical difficulty.

The program must be developed through skating skill and quality rather than through non-skating actions such as sliding on one knee or excessive use of toe steps. The skater/pair must not remain in one place for more than five (5) seconds.

Any technical element exceeding the maximum number as set forth below, will be judged as an illegal element (1.0 deduction). If the minimum required technical elements are not included, a deduction for a “missing element” of 1.0 will be made. The Referee is responsible for such deductions.

Clothing and make-up must be modest, dignified and appropriate for athletic competition – not garish or theatrical in design. Clothing may, however, reflect the character of the music chosen. Clothing must not give the effect of excessive nudity. (ISU Rule 501) The theme of the program should be clear from the skating movements and choreography – regardless of what the skater is wearing. This is not intended to be a Theatre on Ice; Spotlight; or a Showcase event.

Props and accessories may not be used in any part of the artistic programs. Any item that is held in the hand or removed during the performance is considered a prop. Thus, for example, a hat worn throughout the program is not considered to be a prop, but if it is intentionally removed during the performance it is considered a prop. Objects on the ice, thrown in the audience, placed on the boards or on the judges table are not permitted. Costumes that contain particles that may mar or leave anything on the ice surface (feathers, boas, excessive beading) are considered unsafe and are not permitted.

The decorations on costumes must be non-detachable. Part of the costume or decoration falling on the ice will be penalized by a deduction of 1.0 point per program. The deduction for inappropriate clothing or make-up props and accessories (1.0) will be determined by a majority of the judges and the referee.

Illegal elements:

- Somersault type jumps
- Laying on the ice and prolonged and/or stationary kneeling on both knees on the ice.



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The warm-up duration is four minutes for all Artistic Free Skating events.

Artistic Free Skating

Competitions will be held at the Masters Elite, Masters, Gold, Silver and Bronze levels.

The Artistic Free Skate is a competitive program that must include elements of the sport of figure skating. At least one (1) and a maximum of two (2) single jumps MUST be included. A Waltz jump is not considered a listed single jump. At least one (1) and a maximum of two (2) spins MUST be included. No Axel type jumps, double or triple jumps are allowed. No combination jumps are allowed.

RULES RECREATIONAL ICE DANCE PATTERN DANCE COMPETITION

Age Category Kids Ice Dance:

Skaters have not reached the age of eighteen (18) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Age Category Young Adults Ice Dance:

Skaters have reached at least the age of eighteen (18) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Skaters have not reached the age of twenty-nine (29) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Age Category Class 1 Ice Dance:

Skaters have reached at least the age of twenty-nine (29) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Skaters have not reached the age of thirty-nine (39) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Age Category Class 2 Ice Dance:

Skaters have reached at least the age of thirty-nine (39) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Skaters have not reached the age of forty-nine (49) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Age Category Class 3 Ice Dance:

Skaters have reached at least the age of forty-nine (49) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Skaters have not reached the age of fifty-nine (59) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.



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Age Category Class 4 Ice Dance:

Skaters have reached at least the age of fifty-nine (59) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Skaters have not reached the age of sixty-nine (69) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Age Category Class 5 Ice Dance:

Skaters have reached at least the age of sixty-nine (69) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Skaters have not reached the age of seventy-nine (79) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Age Category Class 6 Ice Dance:

Skaters have reached at least the age of seventy-nine (79) by July 1st preceding the competition for Ladies and Men for all categories.

Based on the number of entries, some classes may be combined.

Pattern Dances:

The pattern dances can be skated **solo**, in **couple** or in **shadow** (2-8 skaters).

Each **couple** consists of a man and a lady. The man skates the pattern of the man's steps, the lady skates the lady's steps. When a couple consists of 2 persons of a different age class, the youngest person will determine the age class.

In the **Shadow Ice Dance** categories, the group of skaters can be made up of skaters of any gender. Two subdivisions shall be made: Shadow Ice Dance in teams consisting of **two (2) skaters** and Shadow Ice Dance in teams consisting of **three to eight (3 to 8) skaters**. All skaters have the choice of skating the Man's or the Lady's steps according to their personal preference and regardless of their gender. Skating in the required hold(s) of the dance is also an option: that way two women can participate in this category, with one of them taking the lead. Combinations of skaters in and out of hold are also an option, and even changes along the pattern are possible: changing skating partner(s) during the dance is allowed. As a courtesy, we ask that a female-male team skating in the required hold(s) would participate in the couples category. Groups consisting of 5 or more skaters may choose to start at both sides of the ice rink, distributing the number of skaters or couples as evenly as possible.

Teams consisting of three to eight (3 to 8) skaters should also communicate a team name on the entry form (aside from the team members). If any member of the team cannot participate due to injury or other circumstances, the other team members may still participate; if only one skater remains, they can enter the solo competition, if only two skaters remain, they can enter the couples category or the duo Shadow Ice Dance competition. Please inform us of this fact as soon as possible, so that we can make the necessary preparations.



An ice dancer can enter solo, couple and shadow categories as they like. They may also enter another category with a different partner. Ice dancers may also register in 2 consecutive categories with the same partner(s):

- Pre-Bronze + Bronze
- Bronze + Pre-Silver
- Silver + Pre-Gold

The referee will indicate the starting point of each dance. All pattern dances will be started so that the steps of the first pattern are skated in front of the judges unless otherwise specified by the Referee. If the Referee changes the side to start, the change must be announced at the time of the first draw for starting order.

Factors in each dance for Program Components are:

Skating Skills:	0.75
Timing:	0.75
Performance/Execution:	0.50
Interpretation:	0.50

The new Shadow Ice Dance category shall be judged in the same program components as the other Ice Dance categories. The evaluation of the 'shadow effect' and choice of required hold(s) shall be taken into consideration for the 'performance and execution' score. Obviously, original use of the shadow category may also be reflected in the interpretation score. The choice of (changing of) holds during the dance can also affect the Skating Skills score when it is clearly motivated only by making a certain section easier.

14. Registration:

An info desk will be opened at the entrance of the ice rink.

All competitors must register **one hour before the start of their category** at the latest.

15. Accommodation close to the rink:

Skaters, coaches and supporters may book travel arrangements and accommodations individually and at their own expense.

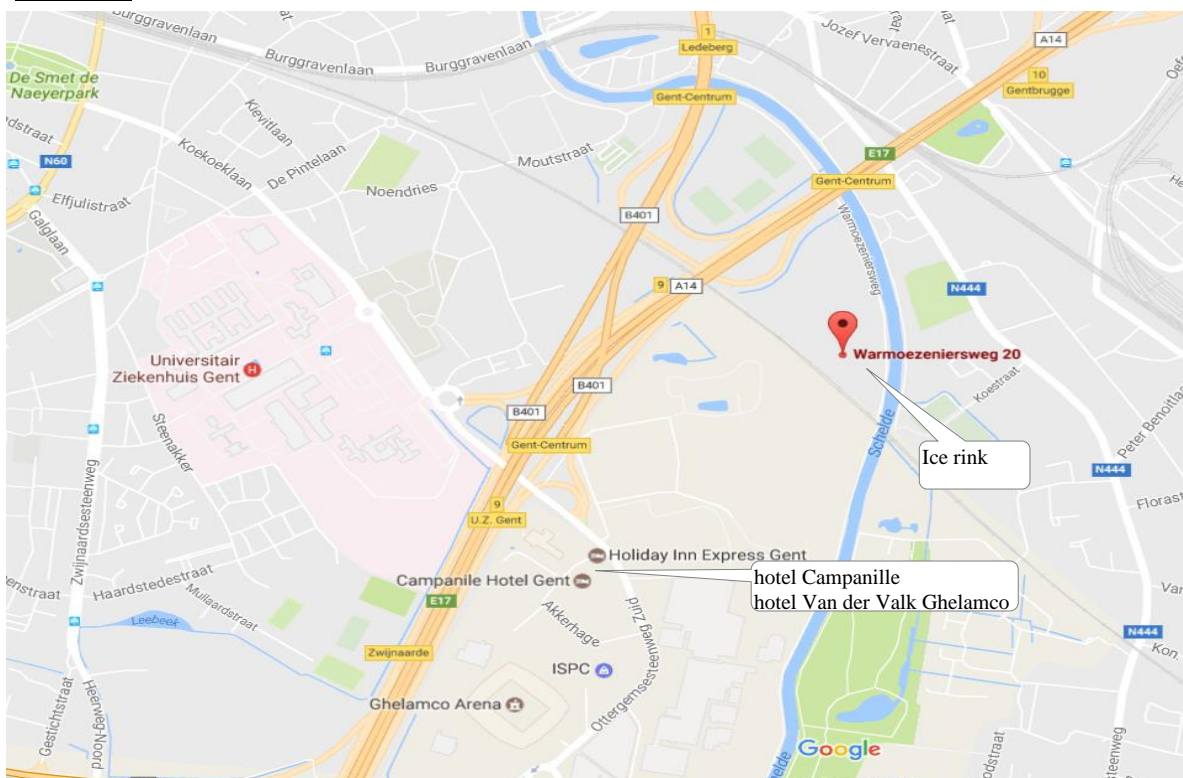
