#### Scenery

Costumes, accessories, scenery and props are allowed. It is however prohibited to throw confetti, paper balls, water or any other object, along with the emission of smoke and any kind of flammable matters. The use of live animals and practicable (e.g. trampolines) is prohibited.

After the announcement of the team, the skaters will have 2:00 minutes to set-up the scenery and get in their starting position.

#### **Deductions**

Judges will not deduct any points for a fall or illegal elements. A deduction of -10% of the total score will be applied for every violation of the rules e.g. overtime, prohibited scenery, late start...

#### <u>Judging</u>

The judges panel is composed of 1 referee, a technical panel and an artistic panel.

The <u>referee</u> is in charge of the judges panel and will make sure that all performances are according to the competition rules. If not, he/she will apply any necessary **deductions**.

Each judges panel awards a mark between 0 and 10, in increments of 0.25 points.

The <u>technical panel</u> will award the 1<sup>st</sup> mark 'technique of performance' based on the following criteria:

- -utilisation of the ice and the space, and the organisation of formations
- -body movements and positions
- -quality of ensembles and rapport between skaters
- -performance of technical elements
- -overall quality of skating for the team

The <u>artistic panel</u> will award the 2<sup>nd</sup> mark '**Artistic mark**' based on the following criteria:

- -presence of the skaters, intensity and impact of the performance
- -creation of a universe
- -theatricality of performance
- -originality and creativity of the performance, and its ability to be understood by the audience

In case of a tie, the second mark will determine the highest placement.

## Composition judges panel

Expenses of all invited judges will be covered by the organisation. Each participating club has the right to enter one judge. This judge should be able to make a certain contribution to the judges panel, otherwise the organising club has the right to ask for a replacement. The organising club will cover all meals during the competition for this judge but will not cover any other expenses e.g. transportation.
